

We would be delighted to invite you to participate:

- If you are in general good health, between the ages of 17-55 you can become a potential blood stem cell donor.
- If you decide to register, it will only take 10 minutes of your time to check you are eligible, complete a consent form and give a quick cheek swab sample.
- Registration Cost £40 (Baker McKenzie employees will be covered by the firm but donations can be made to the cause)

Our drive will be geared to help the Black and Minority Ethnic (**BAME**) community primarily, as those from the BAME community are 3 times **less likely** to find a donor match than those from white Northern European backgrounds. We of course welcome all donors as we are committed to providing support until we find a matching donor for every person in need.
